We could see an overview of what resources were, and were not, available for people experiencing homelessness with pets. In 2022 we have walked through that room, looking at each area a little bit closer and turned on some spot lights to focus our attention. We identified four main areas of need: Veterinary Care, Doggie Day Care, Safe-Keep Foster Care, and Outreach. Within each area we are working to turn on some laser beams to focus even more on the specific needs in each area and evolve systems and resources to address those needs.

I know that this work is happening due to the partnerships we have been blessed to discover along the way. In March, I was invited by My Dog Is My Home (www.mydogismyhome.org) to share our story at their Co-Sheltering Conference. I was deeply honored to have the space to share our dream and find so much support from others who share this passion. Additionally, My Dog Is My Home is working diligently to create a video that tells our story, which has been a dream of mine from the very beginning. ## We have been busy: Program update

Veterinary Care Veterinary Care continues to be one of the top needs, and expenses, we have encountered. We are extremely grateful for the support of the Street Dog Coalition (<a href="www.thestreetdogcoalition.org">www.thestreetdogcoalition.org</a>) for their partnership in providing free clinics to pets of the homeless. In 2022 we were able to assist 13 animals with payments for urgent or emergency veterinary care. There were another 50+ animals served at the three clinics we hosted for the Street Dog Coalition. **Foster Care** 

Safe Keep Foster care has been our biggest challenge. Even though we sponsored the foster care of **7 animals** in 2022, Animal Shelters and Humane Societies across the board are at maximum capacity. There simply aren't enough shelters or homes for the animals in need. Because we rely on partners to provide this care, and they are currently unable to do so to the extent needed, we are redirecting our resources to investigating alternative spaces for animals and intensifying our work to develop a co-shelter facility where people and animals can be housed together. This is our ultimate goal. #InTogetherness



Outreach

Every other week we are present alongside the organization Feet Forward (<a href="www.feetforward.org">www.feetforward.org</a>) in Boulder with a table full of supplies like dog and cat food, treats, toys, harnesses, leashes, and more. We are getting to know the community that gathers there and walk alongside those stories. Each week we see between 8 and 20 individuals who need pet resources. This outreach is at the heart of our work because it is about acknowledging the dignity of all the members of our community. #UnleashCompassion

We continue to be in partnership with HOPE for Longmont in responding to emergencies as they arise. This past December when the weather was dipping to -23degrees, we knew there was a life-threatening situation at hand for those who could not access shelter with their animal. Together with the outstanding street outreach team, we were able to place 2 individuals and their dogs in a hotel for three nights, each with their own room. #HumanAnimalBond


